The Trust honours the life of Sir Albert Coates through publications, education programmes and associated educational awards.

Trust programmes are supported by donations, bequests and fund-raising activities.

#### ABOUT THE ALBERT COATES MEMORIAL TRUST

The Albert Coates Memorial Trust is a volunteer-run, Ballarat-based organisation which, since 1998, has raised funds to present scholarships for medical purposes, with a strong emphasis on regional areas. The scholarships are awarded in areas of interest and relevance to the life and achievements of Sir Albert Coates, the Ballarat-born surgeon of the Thai-Burma Railway.

During World War 1, Albert Coates served in Gallipoli, Egypt and Flanders as a medical orderly and with the Intelligence Corps. At 46 he volunteered for duty in World War II and went as Senior Surgeon with the 2/10th AGH of the 8th Division to Malaya.

Captured by the Japanese in Sumatra he was taken to Burma. As a surgeon on the infamous Thai-Burma railway, he saved hundreds of lives and gave inspired leadership to those with whom he served.

#### REPORT FROM THE CHAIR

DON MOSS OAM FRACS FACS HON. CHAIR

One hundred years ago, Albert Coates returned from his service as a stretcher bearer in WW1 at Gallipoli and the Somme. Despite never attending secondary school, he achieved entry to Melbourne University School of Medicine. He subsequently graduated with 1<sup>st</sup> class honours, a truly remarkable result.

He subsequently trained as a surgeon and worked at Royal Melbourne Hospital, until enlisting as surgeon in the Army during WW2. Seventy-five years ago, he was caring for many thousands of POW's on the Burma end of the infamous Burma Thailand railway. While widely admired by the POW soldiers, his work was not widely recognized in the community.

Twenty years ago, a group of community members in Ballarat set up the Albert Coates Memorial Trust, to remember Coates by educational publications and educational awards in his name. The Trust holds an annual Oration in conjunction with Federation University in Ballarat, and has also set up eight training scholarships in nursing and medicine in conjunction with a number of Universities and the Department of Health.

These scholarships have gradually expanded the awareness of Sir Albert's contributions, and are substantially supported by funds from the Australian Legion, a service organization. While the programme is in the name of an extra-ordinary Australian surgeon, Coates himself would be pleased that it goes towards the education of the future generations of doctors, nurses, paramedics and others.

The Coates Oration in October 2017 was delivered by Hon Tim Fischer AC, who spoke of the significant leading figures and their relative roles in bringing WW1 to an end (Monash, Churchill and others).

The annual luncheon address in May 2018 was given by Judge Sara Hinchey, Senior State Coroner in Victoria. She explained the roles of the Coroner in an entertaining address. Both events attracted large audiences, and were valued educational events for the community.

Sadly, the Treasurer for the Trust, Bruce Clark OAM, died recently after a short illness. Bruce had been a Committee member since 2012, and was Trustee and Treasurer from July 2015-2018. His financial acumen will be missed.

The committee members continue to work hard to further the work of the Trust. With the gradual increase in the numbers of scholarships, the work involved keeps them all well occupied! We appreciate the support of all donors and supporters of the ACMT, and those able to attend the various events.

#### SECRETARY'S REPORT

ROGER TRUDGEON MA HON. SECRETARY

During the year the Coates Trust developed another new scholarship, significant donations were received and increased attendances occurred at Trust functions. The administration of the growing number of scholarships is spread amongst the committee with different members attending the interviews and selection panels for the scholarships.

Membership of the trustees of the Coates Trust saw the retirement of Marie Pryor and the appointment of Shirley McIver. Shirley has served on the committee for some years and has been a great support in the preparation for the lunch functions and a thoughtful contributor to the Trust. Through 2017/2018, Don Moss served as Chair of the Trustees and the committee, with Bruce Clark as Treasurer and Roger Trudgeon as Secretary. The sudden death occurred in August, 2018 of Bruce Clark, a trustee and the Trust's Treasurer since 2015 and committee member since 2012. Bruce's financial background saw the Trust reviewing its management of funds, investment strategy and operating processes. Bruce and Beverley Clark were regular attenders at Coates functions and we acknowledge them both for supporting the work of the Trust.

Chair, Don Moss, concluded negotiations with Deakin University to provide a scholarship to second year students in their Doctor of Medicine course. Students undertake a medical internship and the scholarship assists with the costs involved. The first award will be presented in March 2019.

Mount Pleasant Primary School continues to conduct the Coates project with Year 6 students each year with prizes for the best project by a girl and a boy and two honourable mention prizes. We thank Sebastopol Bowling Club for donating the first prizes, and Robyn and Arthur Coates for the additional prizes. The exhibition of all the student projects was held in the library at the school, with students and family members able to view the exhibition in the time before the Year 6 graduation presentation on the last day of school. We thank Principal Phil Gladman and Year 6 teacher Paul McAloon for their unwavering support and the students for their energetic contribution in creating such interesting projects.

The Trust works closely with the Veterans' Branch of the Department of Premier and Cabinet to work through matters of mutual interest in our relationship with the

Victorian Veterans' Council (VVC). The Coates Trust receives the majority of its funds through the VVC and staff keep us informed about the allocation of the interest earned from the funds originally provided by the Australian Legion of ExService Men and Women which are invested through the VVC.

The Australian Charities and Not-for-profit Commission (ACNC) sets standards for charitable organisations and the Coates Trust complies with the various operational and annual reporting requirements. Reports are submitted online by the secretary, including financial reports and details of the Trust's administrative changes and activities.

A priority for the committee is the financing of the Trust scholarships. We thank the Australian Legion of Ex-Service Men and Women for their generous financial contribution which funds the majority of the scholarship programme. The Trust was very pleased to receive a major donation from the Leckie family which will be employed to develop a further scholarship in the coming year. Federation University Australia, the University of Melbourne, the Australian Catholic University and the University of Notre Dame provide much appreciated support of Trust scholarships and related events. W&D Finance and the Ballaarat Club each funded scholarships, helping broaden the programme.

In an effort to reduce administration costs, the Trust has encouraged supporters to receive newsletters by email and we now have about half the mailing list changed to emails. We thank those who can use this option for helping us in this way.

The Coates Trust depends on the collaboration and commitment of the committee members and many others beyond it to achieve its objectives of providing scholarships and raising awareness of the legacy of Sir Albert Coates. Thank you to the committee and our support group for all you do. The Coates Trust Committee meets each month at Ballarat Legacy and we are greatly indebted to them for providing the boardroom for our meetings. Thanks to Alison Freeman for her excellent catering services. Sadly Alison has had to give up her catering work and we miss her friendly support and excellent sandwiches. High Tech Printing Services continues to provide great support and we thank Ben, Karen and Jason for their excellent work.

In the presently slow and relatively low interest bearing financial climate the ACMT is pleased to report a very significant increase in donations for the financial year, which had a positive impact on our Surplus/ Equity and will flow through to future additional scholarship allocations.

All donations received during the year are gratefully acknowledged. These were numerous and significant. In particular the Trust acknowledges the ongoing support of the Australian Legion of ex-Service Men and Woman through the Victorian Veterans Council.

Furthermore, it is appropriate to highlight a \$50,000 donation from the Leckie Estate, to be utilized for a future scholarship programme (being developed).

By comparison with the previous year donations have increased by 184.51%.

For the Financial Year the Income of the Trust has increased by 137.80%, Equity is up by 42.03%

Consequently, the Trust is fortunate to have a \$73,890 Scholarship carryover into the new financial year (see Audit Report for details).

Both the Oration and the Luncheon have been financially rewarding.

Our reporting responsibilities with the ATO, Australian Charities and Not- for -profit Commission and the Victorian Veterans Council (Legion) are all up to date.

Furthermore, our AUDITED Accounts are attached to this report, it is appropriate to thank Sam Maskell CPA for making himself available, on a voluntary basis.





The Statement of Profit & Loss and Balance Sheet for the ACMT is properly drawn up and gives a true and correct view of financial affairs and operations for the Year.

The Total Equity of the Trust as at 30/06/2018 is \$257,220.42, (Including the James Pryor Fund of \$17,891.17). The above also includes a projected ATO/ GST credit of \$212.28, of which \$20.00 is being claimed back for the June 2018 quarter.

- The Trust is fortunate to have a \$73,890 Scholarship carryover into the new financial year (VVC/ \$22,040, Ballarat Club \$1,350, Leckie Estate \$47,500, W & D \$3,000). This is critical for Cash Flow as Scholarships payments are already commencing in the new financial year!







# LUNCH WITH SPEAKER 2018

#### LUNCHTIME TALK WITH JUDGE SARA HINCHEY

Judge Hinchey returned to her home town to give a lunchtime talk for the Coates Trust on 1 May 2018. She was eloquent, informative and entertaining to the large audience, that included many from the medical/nursing and legal professions.

Of the 45,000 deaths in Victoria each year, some 6500 are reported to the Coroner's office. Judge Hinchey explained the role of the state's 10 coroners, to ascertain certain facts about the death, and make recommendations which may prevent similar deaths in the future.

Of the total deaths reviewed, most are finalised by investigation and a written finding. Only 100 lead to a full inquest. Of the whole, 40% are "natural deaths", 33% the result of accidents, suicides 11%, medical/surgical complications 5%, other causes 10% and only 1% are homicides.

Judge Hinchey also outlined the results of the review of heroin overdose deaths that lead to the recommendation for a medically supervised injecting facility.

She talked about common misconceptions of what coroners do and explained the range of cases investigated and how findings from these cases are used to improve the safety of the public. Her talk was well received and clarified the important role of the Coroner in our community.
