ALBERT COATES AND THE FALL OF SINGAPORE

Albert Coates worked in the 2/10AGH in Malacca (in Malaya) during 1941. He was transferred to Singapore to operate on Sir John Latham (Australian Ambassador to Japan) in September 1941, then escorted him back to Australia. He returned to Singapore on 5th December 1941, and was senior surgeon in Malacca and then Singapore, operating on many casualties.

At the evacuation of Singapore on February 13th, 1942, patients and staff of the AGH embarked for Java. The steamer was sunk and the survivors found themselves on the Dutch-controlled island of Sumatra.

The Singapore garrison surrendered on 15th February.

Coates worked in extremely trying conditions in Sumatra, until capture by the Japanese in Padang on 17th March, 1942. Then began his time as a POW, and his work on the Burma-Thailand railway May 1942-August 1945.



The GRIEVING MOTHER

Sculptor: Peter Corlett

This bronze sculpture to commemorate the mothers who lost family members in wars, was unveiled in Ballarat on 15th February, 2017.

It was sculpted by Peter Corlett and unveiled by the Governor General, His Excellency Sir Peter Cosgrove AK MC. It stands in a garden area adjacent to the iconic Arch of Victory in Ballarat.



75th ANNIVERSARY of the FALL OF SINGAPORE



The DVA arranged an excellent commemorative service for the 75th Anniversary of the Fall of Singapore, held at the Australian Ex-POW Memorial in Ballarat on the 15th February, 2017. The Governor General, His Excellency General the Hon Sir Peter

Cosgrove AK MC (Retd), gave the address, and Major General Simone Wilkie AO the Call to Remembrance.

Some 20 ex-POWs were present, along with a large crowd and the RAN band.

NEW SCHOLARSHIP AT ACU BALLARAT, 2016

The Albert Coates/Australian Legion of Ex Service Men and Women Scholarship awarded to a 2nd year student to assist with elective costs. Available to nursing students at Australian Catholic University, Ballarat

The Albert Coates Memorial Trust scholarship at Australian Catholic University, ACU, was recently established, with an annual award of \$2,500 to a second year Nursing/Paramedicine student, studying in Ballarat, to assist with course costs. **Mark Hocking** is the inaugural recipient and is studying for a double degree in nursing and paramedics.

Roger Trudgeon (Trust Hon. Secretary) spoke on behalf of the Trust and presented Mark with two books, the 'Albert Coates Biography' and 'Glimpses'. Assoc. Prof. Joe Fleming was Master of Ceremonies. The ceremony began with an acknowledgement of Country by Madelaine Sealey. Trust members had the pleasure of meeting with Mark and his parents after the ceremony.



Orator, David Morrison AO

David Morrison AO delivered the oration at the Annual Coates Oration on the 10th October, 2016.

Lieutenant General Morrison was Chief of the Army from 2011-2015. He was the Australian of the Year for 2016, and joins the list of prominent Australians who have been Coates orators.

General Morrison concluded his appointment as Australia's Chief of Army in May 2015. During a 36 year career he saw

service in Bougainville and East Timor. He was awarded an AO in 2010 for outstanding performance and loyalty to his profession. General Morrison is probably best known for his strong public stance on gender equality.
